Recipe Corner

Palatschinken (Crepes)

Ingredients:

- 2 ½ cups flour
- 4+ cups milk
- Pinch salt
- 2 Tbsp sugar
- 3 eggs
- ½ tsp vanilla

Directions:

- 1. Mix ingredients in a large bowl
- 2. Pour a scant amount of batter in a pan over medium-to-low heat
- 3. Flip when firm to cook other side
- 4. Serve filled with jam or cheese mixture (ricotta, powdered sugar, lemon, vanilla)

This crepe recipe is taken from the club's kitchen and is used at our Suppe und Palatschinken event.

With COVID restrictions lifted, we were able to welcome members back on Sunday afternoon, February 5, to enjoy one of the favorite dinners served at the club - Suppe und Palatschinken! Suppe und Palatschinken was traditionally eaten on Fridays in Lent, when many – both in the old country and today – do not eat meat. Over the years, the homemade soup and Palatschinken dinner became one of the most anticipated dinners at the club. This year was no exception, and then some! We received so many reservations that the dinner was served in the upstairs hall for the first time.

Traditionally the meal features homemade soup (generally a potato soup) and Palatschinken (crepes). Our version had a wonderful homemade potato soup, a tomato soup, and crepes stuffed with a choice of a farmer's cheese, apricot preserves, or strawberry preserves. Many members ordered the "plain" Palatschinken that were also available, to be filled with Lekvar, Nocello, and other delicious fillings that the members brought with them.

As in the last few years before the pandemic caused us to pause this event, we are very grateful that our younger generation continues to volunteer to cook these delicacies. In fact, we had multigenerational volunteer and staff cooks in the kitchen this year. The scrumptious potato soup was prepared by Trish Gauss Kelly, who picked up the mantle from her brother, Matt, using her Oma's recipe. Volunteers who made the Palatschinken were the father and son team of first-timer Al Taubenberger and veteran Palatschinken-maker William Taubenberger, board vice-president George Brenner, and kitchen "fixture" Chuck, all supervised by the irreplaceable Hans. This busy group of cooks prepared and filled 600 Palatschinken! It is a testament to their culinary skill that we had virtually no leftovers.

Thank you to all our members and friends who joined us for this Sunday dinner. The upstairs hall was filled to capacity with people who came hungry but left with full stomachs. Several tables had unofficial contests for who ate the most
